

8:30 - Interpretative Ministry-Youth Team



DRIVE-THRU ENACTMENT

The youth, backed by some adults, will present a drive-through Easter Enactment portraying the last days of Christ at 7:30 p.m. April 1, 6 and 7. There will be six stations – The Trial before Pilate; the Whipping Post of Jesus; The Three Crosses, showing Jesus on the central focal cross; The Empty Tomb; The Road to Emmarus; and the Ascension.

Special effects and strategic staging along with biblical characters involved with the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ will create a dramatic portrayal of the meaning of Easter.

Those coming to view the enactment will park, then board a low trailer where they will ride through the various stations. All parking will be on the Sanctuary side along Mintz Road. Limited parking will be on the family center side. Cast parking will be in the field behind the church.

BAPTISMAL SERVICE

Can you think of a better time for a service than on Easter Sunday morning? Easter is about the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Baptism is the symbol of acting out the resurrection of Jesus.
