

SCHEDULE CHANGE!

Starting the first Wednesday night in May we will return to our summer schedule. The days are longer, the public school year is almost over and the demand on the children is not as great.

We look forward to having more time in the Team Kids and Youth programs, as well as the Wednesday evening adult Bible Study. Please note this change on the May Church Calendar of Activities.

CHURCH SECRETARY

We hope to have a recommendation for the church secretarial position by the end of this week with a goal to have this position filled by the first of May. This position is a testimony to our church growth and will help make our programs more efficient. This position will lighten the workload that some of you presently have and at the same time bring needed programs into a central management system.

Pray for the church as it adjusts to the changes that must come about with this new staff position. Pray also for the person that God leads to fill this position.

HELP NEEDED

First, we need you to sign up to visit with one of our guest team leaders. We had 33 from the Mintz family to sign up the first time we had this type revival. We have grown in number since that time, therefore we expect to see more than 33 sign up to visit in this revival.

We want to have a minimum of two Mintz members visiting with one of the guest leaders. There will be a sign-up sheet the circulating in Sunday School classes starting this Sunday. Don't just pass it on, but sign your name and receive a blessing from this witnessing experience. You will not be asked or expected to do any talking, unless that is your desire. Your desire for going may be to learn how to make visits to witness. You can be a part of this ministry by merely signing up to be the designated driver for a particular team.

Second, we need some suggestions of areas you think would be good to visit, such as trailer parks, residential communities, housing developments, and families or indi-

viduals in the community who do not go to church anywhere. We are looking at a 5 - 10 mile radius of our church. We need this information immediately! Inform the pastor now of the areas and individuals you know about. All of us know someone or some area that needs outreach. Think about this seriously. Pick up the phone and call the pastor, or write the information on a card and hand it to the pastor. The time is almost upon us and preparation now is essential.

CHURCH SOFTBALL LEAGUE

If you desire to play on the church softball league this year, please sign the roster on the hall bulletin board. Some of the rules are listed below; however a copy of the entire League rules will be made available to each player:

1. Every player MUST attend church once a week during the ball season and be seen in church services on a regular basis throughout the year. Each pastor is to sign the roster verifying that this is true.

- 2. A player must be at least 15 years old, or entering the 10th grade.
- 3. There will be no throwing or slamming of bats or other equipment result equals an ejection and next game suspension.
- Games will be played on Tuesdays and Fridays. Rain make-up games will be on either Monday or Thursday.
- There is to be no taunting, aggressive behavior or profanity result equals ejection and suspension for the season.
- 6. There is to be no abuse of equipment or property while playing on the Holly Grove field – result equals suspension from the game and for the season. There will be no warning!

All teams will warm up along the right field line or left field line away from spectators. There will be no throwing near the buildings. Players who do this will face suspension.

The first practice will be this Sunday afternoon (April 22) at 5:30 PM at Rose-boro/Salemburg School field.
