

FINISHING STRONG IN 2009

Have you caught the spirit of our final emphasis for 2009? This is not just a catchy phrase, but a vision and a commitment to bring glory to God's work in 2009. 2009 has been a historic year at Mintz and through our obedience, God has blessed us tremendously. If you have not kept your hands on the pulse of what has been going on at Mintz, you have

missed out on some of the most evident and exciting things God is directing. 2009 has been a



strong year from day one. We had new and God-sized challenges ahead of us, but together we moved forward trusting God to fill in the blanks of our lack of vision or faith. Let's review a few things:

1. We approved the largest operating budget to date for Mintz Baptist. You have been kept informed throughout the year on how we were doing and it appears that we will meet this budget.

- 2. MCA was started in obedience to God's leadership. Mintz had no funds, faced many improvements to our building, had no operating budget, had no faculty, no students and faced doubts in the community and even perhaps within our own fellowship. But, praise God, we have met every obstacle, overcome doubts, enrolled 28 students, hired three wonderful, talented and Christloving teachers, filled needed part -time positions and when this school ends, it appears the school will operate in "the black." Wow! Who says God is not alive among His church?
- 3. We have paid two large loans. We borrowed approximately \$22,000 from the building fund. These funds were needed for the new well, pump house, driveway and engineering fees. We have repaid that amount except for \$6,000 which will be put in the 2010 budget. We faced an outstanding \$20,000 land-clearing bill and by exceeding our Homecoming goal, praise God we paid it!
- 4. We presently have in our Building Fund \$74,557 to go toward our future expansion.
- 5. We had numerical growth in our church membership by letter and by baptisms.
- 6. We finished strong in November -Sunday School averaged 126 with a high attendance of 141. We averaged 8 visitors per Sunday. Worship attendance averaged approximately 85% capacity. November's

income was only \$37.19 short of meeting that month's budget. MCA added 2 new pupils. We met our special offering goal for the Children's Home. Who says God is not awesome?

There are many other things which could be listed, but we only highlighted six. We now begin December with excitement and determination to definitely finish strong in 2009. It is our prayer that if you have not caught the spirit of togetherness in finishing 2009 strong, you will. We want to exceed the things accomplished in November and pack God's House in honor and worship of Him. What a way to magnify His birthday!

On Thursday night, December 10, at 7:00 PM our academy students will present their first Christmas program. Plan to attend and support MCA. A great program is planned and your heart will be blessed by being present.

The annual Roseboro Christmas parade will be this Friday night, De-

cember 11, and MCA will have a float in the parade. We hope you will be in the crowd when our students come by to give them a big cheer.

There is a great need to build up a scholarship reserve in order to help future students who may need assistance. If your gift to MCA does not specify "scholarship" the amount will go into the operating budget of MCA. Scholarship money can only be spent on scholarships. This fund is managed by the Scholarship Committee Chairperson, Deborah Johnson.

During 2009, God has blessed MCA financially through the generous and sacrificial support of many. At the conclusion of our first school year, you will be amazed at how God has worked. A full financial report will be shared with the church in the near future. Continue to pray for our school.


These prayer times will be held on the first and third Sunday afternoons
